As many of you have heard, Father Vincent Chavez, the pastor of St. Therese is on sabbatical. He will be gone for 6 months. Archbishop Wester has assigned a Deacon Larry Carmony to administration of the parish and has assigned Deacon Michael Wesley to oversee Sacraments for the parish and the school. I have been in contact with Deacon Wesley, and he will be providing a Communion service for most of the school Masses on Thursdays. The students will be able to participate in the readings, ushering, altar serving and in choir. We will keep our Mass Day on Thursdays beginning at 8:15 a.m. I welcome parents, grandparents, and any other persons to join us on Thursdays. We will have Adoration after the Masses, unless another event, such as awards, or a funeral are scheduled.

The budget continues to be in good shape! We are working hard to keep costs down yet providing opportunities for students and families.

We are preparing our budget for the next school year. We have decided to keep tuition at \$4800 for another year! We are also offering an incentive for enrollment. If you register your student by December 31, the registration fee will be only \$200 instead of \$250 fee. January 1 the fee will go back up to \$250. Registration will open to

School Christmas Program

Students are to wear a conservative Christmas outfit.

Please, no low-cut dresses/shirts, no jeans, skirts/dresses must not be more than 1 inch above the knee. Please have shoes for your child that they can walk in on marble floors. They may have to walk up / down a set of stairs and will have to step up on the altar. Students also have the option of wearing their complete Mass uniform. School Dress Code

Just a reminder that students (male and female) should not have highlights or colored hair, artificial nails, non-prescription contacts or wear make-up. Boy's hair should be cut above the collar and not have any shapes or razor art in their cuts. For both boys and girls, hair/bangs should not cover their eyes. We ask that girls keep hair items to a simple hair tie or STS uniform headband or scrunchie. No big bows or jewelry/beads in their hair. Shoes and other items for your student: please make sure that shoes should be regular sneakers that are white, black or blue; no high tops, no Vans with checks or designs, no light-ups and no wheels on the shoes. Please no boots; heels on student shoes no more than an inch. Please keep socks conservative: white, black, or blue. A small swish is fine, but no graffiti or images on the socks. Please do not have students wear the no show socks. They must be ankle or knee socks for both boys and girls. Thank you for helping in honoring the dress code for the school!
