


Financial Corner

Faith Formation

St. Andrew Christmas Novena

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born Of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour

vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother.

It is piously believed that whoever recites the St. Andrew Christmas novena prayer FIFTEEN times each day from the feast of St. Andrew (November 30th) until Christmas Eve will obtain the favor requested.

The month of December is dedicated to the **Immaculate Conception**. The first 24 days of December fall during the liturgical season known as of **Advent** and are represented by the liturgical color purple — a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart. The remaining days of December mark the beginning of the **Christmas** season. The liturgical color changes to white or gold — a symbol of joy, purity and innocence. The Holy Innocents

During this octave of Christmas, the Church celebrates the memory of the small children of the neighborhood of Bethlehem put to death by Herod. Sacrificed by a wicked monarch, these innocent lives bear witness to Christ who was persecuted from the time of His birth by a world which would not receive Him. It is Christ Himself who is at stake in this mass-murder of the children; already the choice, for or against Him, is put clearly before men. But the persecutors are powerless, for Christ came to perform a work of salvation that nothing can prevent; when He fell into the hands of His enemies at the time chosen by God it was to redeem the world by His own Blood.

The feast of the Holy Innocents is an excellent time for parents to inaugurate the custom of blessing their children. From the Ritual comes the form which we use on solemn occasions, such as First Communion. But parents can simply sign a cross on the child's forehead with the right thumb dipped in holy water and say: May God bless you, and may He be the Guardian of your heart and mind—the Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.



St. Therese had its accreditation on November 27, 28, and 29. Catholic school accreditation is a process for determining the quality of a school's overall work looking at four domains:

- ✓ Catholic Identity
- ✓ Governance and Leadership
- ✓ Academic Excellence
- ✓ Operational Vitality

St. Therese school examines itself in order to understand what is working well for the total school community and what it needs to do better to meet the learning needs of the students and to ensure long-term viability and vitality. We wrote a self-study on each of the four domains listed above. A team of educators came to the school observed, interviewed, and looked at evidence of what was written. Enrollment for the 2024-2025 School Year

Enrollment for the Fall is underway. Many have secured seats for next school year! Currently, returning families have the opportunity to enroll their student(s) for a registration fee of \$200 until December 31.

January 1, 2024, enrollment will open to those seeking a Catholic Education that is not currently part of our community. Registration fee will go up to \$250 on January 1. I have had many interested in St. Therese and have given quite a few tours and have several scheduled in the weeks to come. As many of you know, Fatima Catholic School is closing in May. Families are seeking to continue their children's Catholic education.

Please consider enrolling during this reduced registration period to secure a seat for your child. To enroll:

- 1. Log into your FACTS SIS account.
- 2. Scroll down to Apply/Enroll
- 3. Click on Enrollment/reenrollment
- 4. Click on blue link that state "click here to open enrollment"
- 5. Under the Packet Status, click on "Start Enrollment Packet"
- 6. Go through all the pages and make sure all needed boxes are filled. If you get a yellow triangle on the left screen, you must address those areas. Finally, click on the last page and submit enrollment. You are welcome to check with me to see if your enrollment was submitted successfully.

Just a reminder that students (male and female) should not have highlights or colored hair, artificial ns, non-prescription contacts or wear make-up. Boy's hair should be cut above the collar and not have any shapes or razor art in their cuts. For both boys and girls, hair/bangs should not cover their eyes. We ask that girls keep hair items to a simple hair tie or STS uniform headband or scrunchie. No big bows or jewelry/beads in their hair. Shoes and other items for your student: please make sure that shoes should be regular sneakers that are white, black or blue; no high tops, no Vans with checks or designs, no light-ups and no wheels on the shoes. Please no boots; heels on student shoes no more than an inch. Please keep socks conservative: white, black, or blue. A small swish is fine, but no graffiti or images on the socks. Please do not have students wear the no show socks. They must be ankle or knee socks for both boys and girls. Thank you for helping in honoring the dress code for the school! This is referenced in the handbook.



Virtus is an Archdiocesan training for all volunteers that helps adults learn to recognize the warning signs of abuse, and it shows them the appropriate way to respond to suspicious behavior. If you are planning on attending or volunteering in any capacity at the school, even if only driving or being with your own child, please take the time to take "Protecting God's Children" online. The certificate is turned into the front office and is good for five (5) years. This will also cover any volunteering in any of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe communities.
